



NOTES ON THE CALENDAR

- 1. Most of the races will require pre-entry.
- 2. The POINT SEASON for NMPRA Racing has been reduced by two months in order to equalize the competition nationally. The decision was made by vote of the District Vice-Presidents of NMPRA. As a consequence of this decision, several events that had been tentatively scheduled by the individual clubs for April and October have been moved into the newly-restricted point season, since those clubs (in particular, San Gabriel, the FAST Club, and the Valley Flyers) specifically asked that their events be included within the point season. This is also true of the Bakersfield event.
- 3. Since eight possible weekends for point racing were eliminated from the calendar by the NAPRA action, there was no hope of spacing the Formula I/FAI races in alternate weeks as had been anticipated.
- 4. Another sonsideration which cramped the schedule was the FAI Team Selection procedures, which also establish a restricted point season. Since it would obviously be disadvantageous to West Coast Fliers to have a significant number of Pattern events outside this season, the usually very late Valley Flyers Stunt event was moved into the season. Even so, there are only three such contests in Southern California. There are slots set up for two others, if clubs will volunteer to host them.
