CONTEST REFORTS (Or Valley Flyers in Action in Competition)

Ron Clem is the only member that made it up to Sunnyvale to the 1/2 A Pylon Championships. He joined forces with several other So. Cal. flyers to "show 'em how it's done". Ron volunteered to co-ord-inate the standardization of the rules for next year. The following is extracted from the Camarillo Flying Circus newsletter by Randy Wilson, who also attended the event.

... In another heat Clem was coming around pylon #2, the ground jumped up and claimed damage to his plane. 
