OHN PAHLOW won the November Model of the Month award for the second time in 1976 with his original design, scratch built Hodge-Podge. It is a sport pattern design with a 67" span, 670 sq. in. symmetrical airfoil wing which like the stab is balsa over foam. The fuselage is balsa covered with glass cloth, resin and K&B Superpoxy. The 8 1/4 lb. airplane is powered by a K&B Lee Custom .61 pumper with F.D.P. and is guided by a Kraft radio. John reports it flys "great." Standing in the picture from left to right are Tom Cone with his U.K. Fokker, Bob Wilde with Sonny Meyer's Cricket and Angus Crosbie with Tom Barbour's Shrike who tied for second.

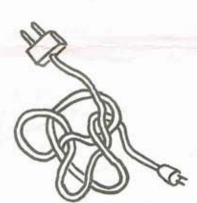

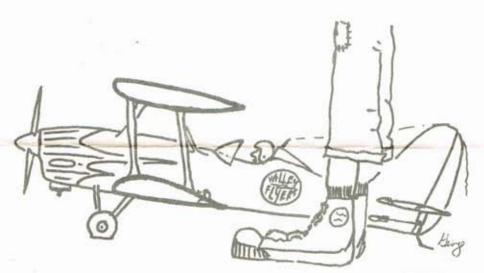
Len Katz has agreed to continue as our LAMA representative and

New member, Larry Laulom (Crazy to his caller) has agreed to run a Formula 500 contest, Tom Mead the Speed Trials and Jim Oddino and/or his partner at S&O Radios Bill Salkowski the pattern contest.

By meeting night we will have the contest schedule worked out. We are planning to hold the following contests: March, 1/2 A Pylon; April, Pattern (2 day); May, Club Formula 500 Training Day and Formula 500 two weeks later; June, Scale; July, alternate for April pattern contest; 7-14 August, the NATS at March AFB; September, 1/2 A Pylon Championships (2 day); and October, The Speed Trials.

It looks like three or four Formula 1 races and perhaps a 1/4 Midget race will have to be held at the Basin also because Whittier is torn up. We have talked to the Parks and Recs. and it is doubtful that they will issue contest permits for more than three days per month or for contests on consecutive weekends. This is in response to objecting sport flyers. Not counting Formula 1 contests that we may be allowed to hold, our traditional contests will take 12 of the available 21 contest days so the scheduling problem is obvious. It looks like the contest season will have to start early to get all the races in before the NMPRA cutoff date.

HAVE YA FLOWN IT YET MISTER?

The Permagloss Coverite is great stuff but a person using it for the first time should definitely read the instruction sheet which comes with each roll. It requires much higher heat for application than Monokote or Solarfilm and the sealing iron has to be re-set higher than the normal maximum setting. The instructions explain how to do this. Also, because the surface is less slippery than Monokote it is difficult to slide the iron over it without catching. I found that a pressing action works much better than sliding.

Another thing that they don't tell you in the instructions is that the stuff has grain, that is, it shrinks more in one direction than the other. The direction of greatest shrinkage is parallel to the edge that first comes off the roll. Cutting wing panels with the span in this direction will give you a surface that stays flat over open structure. Cutting panels 90° to this direction will give you a surface that swoops in-between the ribs like my Stearman. Just be sure you cut all panels in the same direction once you decide which appearance you prefer.

The panel lines and surface details such as trim tab outlines, fuel tanks, etc. were applied with a standard technical or drafting pen and a straightedge. The ink is the type used for working on mylar and is NOT waterproof. There are several reasons for this. First, errors can be wetted and erased easily. Second, while not fuel proof, it will stand up to a sealing coat of clear dope, acrylic lacquer or urethane varnish. Standard waterproof inks will not "take" to the Coverite, are not fuel proof, and will run when hit with lacquer.

One final note. Since I couldn't find decals of the proper size for the registration numbers and aircraft type to go on the vertical fin and rudder, I made my own. To do this, you take a short length of gummed tape like they use to hold the brown paper wrapping on parcels to be mailed. With the dried glue side up, apply a couple of coats of clear dope over the glue. Then lay out your number and letter sequence with a sheet of Prestype. These are the ones that come off when you rub the back of the sheet, available at stationery stores. Cover the letters with a couple more coats of clear dope. Now when you soak this strip in a dish of water the glue will soften and the dope film and letters will slide off like a decal. You can make any custom decal in a similar manner! Simple, heh?
