

It has been arranged for Reed Packard the originator and custodian of this grandiouse volume to bring it to the May 9 th meeting for display. Maybe he can be induced to tell us a little about some of the history buried in the pages. Anyone with a surviving R/C model relic from those early days of the Club is invited to dust it off and

when you examine the Scrap Book you will notice that it has not been kept up with the pace of the club, since about 1973. Matter of fact, my Japanese "Tony" was the November winner of the Model of the Month that year and it is to me---conspicuous for it's absence.

There are lots of fine models that have been built and flown by Valley Flyers that deserve prominent historical recognition. Our Scrap Book is plenty large enough for all of it, as you will see. Reed has a fine collection of Model of the Month winners, contest winners, fun flys, field dedication ceremonies, Club family portraits, etc. Mike Stecker has been back-up photographer for Reed and he, too, has good file of photos. We have had a number of National Champions come through our ranks; several record holders, too.

Other interesting events in need of immortalizing are original-designed models by Valley Flyers. There is not always room for each one to get published in magazine articles, but a few photo and a paragraph or two in the Scrap Book would record that great milestone for the originator. There must be a long list of those, and I am sure the originator would be pleased to turn up a photo or two for the Scrap Book. Some of these designs have become popular kits and some have been published in model magazine articles. Several come to mind, but one in particular is covered in the Scrap Book. How many of you were aware of a model designed by a group of hyperactive Club members, built several of them and then published a construction article in a magazine? The plane was named "Valley Flyer", what else? That was before my time, but I do remember reading the article. At least one of the team members is still in the club and I'll bet he would be happy to reminisce about it.

The point of all this rambling should be obvious, we are in need of a dedicated and conscientious historian to accumulate, organize and arrange material, then update the Scrap Book. Here is an excellent opportunity for those who don't want to be Directors or President, or contest directors, or flagmen, or lap counters, or field workers, or sign painters, or coffee makers, or ticket sellers, or Newsletter editor (any volunteers?). You can do this job in your own way and in your time. Even better, a small group could tackle this as a project and complete the task in short order.

Valley Flyers did real well in Standard class. Standards and Experts flew in the same heats which seems to be the trend with the lower number of entrants these days. Scoring was kept separate by class, naturally.

Special gifts were presented to Betty Stream and Suzy Stream by the CD for their contributions of bodily assistance at many of the Valley Flyer contests over the past couple of years. Financially the race was a great success and added over \$90 to the club treasury.

MODEL OF THE MONTH: Winner of the April Trophy was upstaged by the gigantic model (?) "parked" in the center of the front cover photo. JOHN SWIFT's winning racy bipe is shown in the upper right. It is a truly beautiful original design which is reminiscent of a Formula I racer. He calls it "Brush Fire" which matches the white, red, orange, and brown Superpoxy paint job. Other details are: 6# 3 oz weight, K&B 40R/C, 10% thick airfoils, 780 mg. in. wing area, all balsa construction, Coverite on wings, "Miss Dara" canopy, Prather gear and pants. (John's Formula I experience is showing.)

Other Show-and-tell participants shown (clockwise from the lower left) are: EARL LEVIN with a yellow MRC Dune Buggy powered by a K&B 3.5cc. BARRY EDSON is holding his Formula 500 racer finished in blue and yellow Monokote and powered by a K&B 6.5cc FR. coundn't hold his original design high-winger. It started as a tail-dragger but was quickly converted to a tri-gear after pricing the prop. It is constructed of popular plywood (no balsa), covered with orange and white Permagloss, 124" span, 1900 sq. in. area, 20 lbs. weight, and powered by a chain-saw engine (converted after he used it to cut up the plywood?). WAYNE MCELRATH'S 1/2A Q-TEE 1s dwarfted as it sits on top of Bert's big mother. STEVE UPTON must have a model factory going. Here he displays another product, a Top Flight TrainerMaster on which he used up some of his Dad's Jap tissue and nitrate dope. JOHN SWIFT, the "Winna". MORT ROSENTHAL kneels at the tip of his Antic Bipe which was the runner-up. It is finished with natural colored Coverite, sports wire wheels and is powered by an OS 60 4-cycle engine.
