LeFlore, 28, told doctors he had accidentally splashed some strong, quick-setting glue in his eyes while repairing a lamp at his home Sunday afternoon.



### MEDIOCRE SCALE



### FORMULA MEDIOCRE

Plane finishing race in least number of laps will be the RULES: winner.


